About Craig Kline



Craig Kline graduated from HTHS in 1988. He lived in Haddon Township all but 10 years of his life. He passed away in April of 2022 following a long but brave battle with cancer. He was 52 years old. He was a sweet, kind person who had a lightning-fast wit that kept everyone entertained.

Craig was a very dedicated student at HTHS and played football and was on the wrestling team. In his younger years he was an excellent baseball player. Education was extremely important to Craig and he constantly strove for academic excellence.

After graduating from HTHS in 1988, Craig graduated from Pace University's Lubin School of Business in Pleasantville, New York with a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration, then received a Master's in Management Information Systems from Temple University. Craig held many roles during his lifetime. During his working years he worked in marketing, strategic planning, finance, and information technology. His work centered in local healthcare companies such as Virtua Health, The Fox Chase Cancer Center, The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, and The University of Pennsylvania Health System.

From elementary school and for the remainder of his life, "Kliner" had a group of friends that he aptly named "The Fifteen". He became the organizer of the group's good times. He was the first of The Fifteen to purchase a house (in HT) that was the center of parties and a venue for sports. Craig was an avid Philadelphia sports fan, especially the Eagles, and a constant concert goer. His love for music never ceased. He taught himself to play guitar, bass guitar, keyboards, and drums.

Craig joined the HTHS Alumni Association in 2008 and served as President from 2009 to 2011 where he created the HTHSAA Facebook Group which has become an integral part of keeping connected with our Alumni. He remained on the council serving a Vice President until the end. When the school asked for help on a project or an unfulfilled need, Craig was always on board. He would say "You had me at "the school called and asked if we could..."

Above all, Craig loved his family. He was a proud father to his three children, Ileana, Lucas, and Maya, with whom he shared his overall drive and his passions for sports and music. Craig always looked after his mother's well-being. He was her absolute hero.
