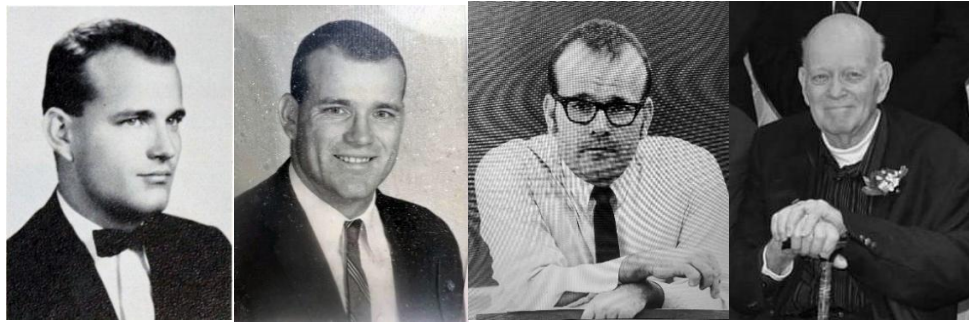

About Mr. Al Tanner

HTHS Teacher of History, Humanities and Economics

Legendary Cross Country, Track and Field Coach with multiple State Championships



Abraham Lincoln is quoted as saying..."In the end, it's not the years in your life that count. It's the life in your years." Mr. Tanner was a huge fan of President Lincoln and an avid history junkie.

Al Tanner spent most of life in Haddon Township. His wife, Bobbi, remains in town at their home and loves sharing stories about this larger-than-life figure that many of us knew and respected.

When Mr. Tanner was hired at Haddon Twp. High School, his career flourished. Al was a dynamic, innovative and demanding, yet caring teacher and coach. He was as proud of the Humanities course he developed as he was of the state championship cross-country and track and field teams that he led. He started out as an assistant coach for the newly formed football team but later transitioned to Cross Country and Track. Tanner possessed a booming voice and unyielding energy. He had a knack for seeing potential in the unlikeliest of people and was tireless in making them see it too. He then relentlessly worked, occasionally by unconventional means, to pull it to the surface whether it was on the field of play or in the classroom. If you knew Al Tanner, you almost certainly have an Al Tanner story.

In 1977, Mr. Tanner moved on to Moorestown High School in Moorestown, NJ where he taught history and economics. In 1987, he was named the New Jersey Economics Educator of the Year. He became the chairman of the Social Studies department, coached track and field and cross country. In 1995, he retired from education, serving as an assistant track coach for a few seasons at Haddonfield Memorial High School. He later was enshrined in the inaugural class of the Haddon Township High School Athletic Hall of Fame and was inducted in 2007 into the South Jersey Track and Field Hall of Fame. He last attended the HT Hall of Fame ceremony in 2018 when the 1976 Cross Country team was inducted. His heart would always remain a "Hawk".

Of the thousands of students and athletes he mentored, his mantra was to strive to succeed, never give up and always give your best. There are really no words to describe his impact on the countless lives he touched throughout his time at HTHS. If you ask 100 alumni of that era who the most impactful teachers were, Mr. Tanner is always in the top two. He cared so much, and he was so good at it.
